**BSO-BSOP**                      **Basic Safety Orientation**

**COURSE OVERVIEW**                      This classroom-based course provides a review of safe work planning processes with a focus on hazards that are posing relatively substantial risk to workers across our region. This course is valid for three years and is required for entry into member sites.

**PROGRAM CONTENT**                      **BSO Classroom**

1. Identify cultural norms of the region regarding respect, inclusion, and teamwork (3.1)
2. Associate legal rights of workers (know, refuse, participate) to construction work at member sites (1.1)
3. Define due diligence and how it connects all parties per the internal responsibility system (1.1)
4. Refresh on selected hazards and controls from prerequisite / previous training (2.1)
5. Identify high-risk hazards for construction work at BASES member sites (2.1)
6. Learners will be able to recognize the value in safe work planning as related to the following: (2.2)
  - a. Safety Board
  - b. Toolbox talks
  - c. Job Safety Analysis
  - d. Safe Work Permits
  - e. TASC Cards
7. Understand the importance of incident reporting as a required element of learning and improvement (3.2)
8. Review site and regional emergency preparedness processes (new)
9. Identify mental health as a foundation to all elements of safe work planning, interactions, decisions (new)
10. Explain how to identify mental health stressors and how to support co-workers (new)

**TARGET AUDIENCE**                      All contractors and building trades who work on refinery sites in the Sarnia-Lambton region.
